

## **Table Tags**

<b>Tag</b>	<b>Description</b>
<a href="#">&lt;table&gt;</a>	Defines a table
<a href="#">&lt;th&gt;</a>	Defines a table header
<a href="#">&lt;tr&gt;</a>	Defines a table row
<a href="#">&lt;td&gt;</a>	Defines a table cell

\*These are the main tags you will use to build a table using html

## **PART A: The basic table**

An important thing to know: if you make a table border = 1, then there will be a border around the table (the example will show you). If you make the table border = 0, then there will be no borders (good for tables of images).

To make a table that looks like this:

100	200	300
-----	-----	-----

You type:

```
<table border="1">  
<tr>  
  <td>100</td>  
  <td>200</td>  
  <td>300</td>  
</tr>  
</table>
```

\*If you made the first line read `<table border="0">` then the box around the 100 would disappear

To make a table that looks like this:

100	200	300
400	500	600

You type:

```
<table border="1">
<tr>
  <td>100</td>
  <td>200</td>
  <td>300</td>
</tr>
<tr>
  <td>400</td>
  <td>500</td>
  <td>600</td>
</tr>
</table>
```

\*NOW, to change the numbers in the table to anything else, just type something else in their place. MAKE SURE you DO NOT delete any of the < or > parts or your table won't work.

To put headings in your table:

<b>Heading</b>	<b>Another Heading</b>
row 1, cell 1	row 1, cell 2
row 2, cell 1	row 2, cell 2

You type:

```
<table border="1">
<tr>
  <th>Heading</th>
  <th>Another Heading</th>
</tr>
<tr>
  <td>row 1, cell 1</td>
  <td>row 1, cell 2</td>
</tr>
<tr>
  <td>row 2, cell 1</td>
  <td>row 2, cell 2</td>
</tr>
</table>
```

## PART B: Refining the basics

To center everything in a table and “polish” it up a little, you have to use cellpadding:

**Without cellpadding** (what we’ve already been looking at):

First	Row
Second	Row

**With cellpadding** (so pretty!):

First	Row
Second	Row

You type:

```
<table border="1"
cellpadding="10">
<tr>
  <td>First</td>
  <td>Row</td>
</tr>
<tr>
  <td>Second</td>
  <td>Row</td>
</tr>
</table>
```

## PART C: Tables of Images

To make a table with images, the easiest thing to do is just add them into a content block, especially if you only want one row of images along the bottom of a page that link to sponsor sites (for example).

You need to save image files of the logos you want to put in the table.

Jpeg files are the easiest.

Save them in your IMS SiteManager **Media Loader** so that everything works properly. Make sure the logo image is the correct size **ALREADY**. You cannot adjust the size in the Media Loader like you can in content blocks.

In the content block, you first want to create the link to the site you go to when you click on the image logo.

Then, you add the image file that will be displayed on your page and linked to:

To get images in a row like this:



You type:

```
<a href="http://visitdowntownmadison.com/"></a><a
href="http://visitdowntownmadison.com/shop_map.php"></a>
```

The `<a>` tag is always for the website you are linking to:

```
<a href="http://visitdowntownmadison.com/"> LINKS TO BID website
```

The `` is for the image in your media loader.

After the `src="` you copy and paste the URL that is associated with your logo image in the media loader

Don't forget to close the tag for the link `</a>`

For another image, just repeat, like above.
